## Introduction


This guide was made as a replacement to the Nation Guide delegates normally develop. It has a purpose to unify the information that will be used within the committee.

Most of our information is based on projections that have already been made.


# Tentative World map for topic 1

## California

- Government system: One-party system- influenced by the democratic party
- 3. Date of Independence/Establishment: 2040 (main cause: economic and ideological independence)
- 4. Official language(s): N.A Predominant English
- 5. Population: 55'000,000
- 6. Major religions: 65% Atheism, 20% Catholic, 15% Jewish
- 7. GDP (in PPP; in US trillions): 6 trillion dollars

The former state of California became independent from the US by diplomatic and orderly means, having neutral relationships with the country. They currently represent substantial trade partners.

California is known to be a very progressive and liberal country with rapid population growth, mostly due to high immigration rates.

Capitalism is widely endorsed in the country. Low tax rates are compensated by generous donations; consequently, private companies have considerable input in the government and its actions.

California is known for being an active participant in international affairs, with strong minded opinions, always seeking development and the well being of its citizens.

China's belt and road initiative gained substantial strength in 2030, Steadily gaining more power on African territory. Likewise, external debt from African countries toward China increased drastically. Through a prolonged process, China gained territory in the continent, resulting in somewhat poor relationships with the countries involved. Due to the remaining external debt, peaceful and diplomatic relationships are maintained.

China's economic growth has consistently increased over the past decades. Making it one the most powerful economic countries. Nonetheless, it has been heavily criticized for its lack of sensibility toward the environment; It is the country with highest deforestation rates, likewise, it is the country with highest fossil fuel consumption and manufactured goods.

Regarding life quality and demographic indicators, China is experiencing an abysmal economic gap between its citizens, making nearly a third of its population live close to the poverty line. Additionally, having some of the worst policies on human rights and human rights. It is speculated that in the years to come, uprisings will occur due to the everlasting political rule.

# Egypt

After work reforms were established in 2016, Egypts economy improved dramatically. On average, there was a 4% positive growth each year for the following decades.

When Russia sought to obtain more territory and Siberia decided to gain independence, Egypt sided with Russia, causing a stir on its standings with other countries. There was a general disapproval of this matter as the country had a strategic partnership with NATO since the 90'. As a result, its relations with the US and even China were severed.

As the country presents a majority of muslim citicens, the Islamic state has shown some interest on the countries support. Over the past couple years, some mild confrontations have ensued as the Arab Republic of Egypt has shown no interest in negotiating with the Islamic State.

Toward 2025, France and its citizens became weary of its muslim population, set demographic developed a rather hostile and wearysome behaviour. In the past years most muslims have left the country and a medium scale migration occurred in the country. Since then, skepticism has ignited on French citizens.

Moreover, France has been a leading country regarding environmental policies. In 2030, fulfilling its goal on cutting greenhouse gas emissions, water pollution, waste management and biodiversity conservation.

The country has shown to be a leader in innovation and development, becoming a great trade partner and ally of California; as they share the same goal in improving life quality and natural conservation.

Germany has remained as the strongest economy in Europe, Development and innovation have been a key factor to this success. Both France and the Netherlands have become great allies of the country; becoming significant trade partners and political allies.

On the other hand, Germany's political climate has become rather tense as for the past five elections, presidents from different parties have been chosen. Hence, generating swift and steep changes on policies and regulations. It is expected that if the trend were to continue, civil uprisings might ensue and a severely divided nation could rise.

## Gran Colombia

Following an economic and immigrant crisis from Venezuela in 2030, Colombia sought to take over its territory. With a mild use of force and a large acceptance from the public, the country annexed the territory in 2035.

With aspirations to gain more power, dialogues and some economic interventions, Panama and Ecuador joined the 'Gran Colombia' over a transitional period from 2044 to 2048. Nowadays, Gran Colombia is considered as one of the most powerful in Latin America, and shows a promising future for its economy and society.

As a negative result from this process, a social division is still defined - in which an older demographic is still wary of those from other former nationalities - likewise, the political representation in the country is still facing a process of adjustments.

It is speculated that the military will gain more power as the sociopolitical disagreements increase.

- 5. Population: 1,700,000,000
- 6. Major religions: Hindu 79.8%, Muslim 14.2%, Christian 2.3%, Sikh 1.7%, other and unspecified 2%
- 7. GDP (in PPP; in US trillions): 44,1 trillion dollars

The Republic of India is facing one of its toughest times, although it possesses a good economy; a vast breach exists between its citizens. It is estimated that nearly 70% of its population represents only 10% of the entire economy. Furthermore, religious extremism has left the overall development of the nation behind, this has resulted in some unsafe practices affecting the environment gravely. An alarming amount of water sources are now polluted. Likewise, a periodic increase in food shortages is occurring.

With the alarmingly high population, urban centers have developed an immensely high density, affecting quality of life gravely.

Having such dense populations represents a risk factor, as a sudden migration might be too overwhelming for the country's current health, mobilization and educational infrastructure and resources.

Internationally, India maintains good relationships and has presented a very neutral and propositive posture.

## Islamic Republic

- 3. Date of Independence/Establishment: hasn't been recognised as a country yet; to be discussed in topic 1.
- 4. Official language(s): Arabic
- 5. Population: 1,590,000,000
- 6. Major religions: Islam
- 7. GDP (in PPP; in US trillions): 58,8 trillion dollars

The islamic republic emerged after the takeover of Afghan and Pakistani territory in 2025, the international community held the US responsible for these and future events due to bad management and doubtful morals.

Over the course of three decades, Belligerent Armed groups from former Afghan territory have surged and gained strength. Funding for these groups comes primarily from exports on raw materials, particularly minerals. Most importantly, from the production of opiates, its derivatives and related products which skyrocketed in 2030 and have seen a broader market. Over the course of continuing years, the Islamic State has sought to obtain new territory (refer to map 1 to observe current territory) It is speculated that it aspires to take over even more territory, spreading to africa, europe and asia.

The Islamic Republic is the *new state bor*n during the first topic. Consequently, it hasn't been recognised as an official country yet. Delegates are expected to debate and resolve the matter at hand Bear in mind that proceeding the arrival of the presumed Messiah, the Muslim community becomes even more beligerent and diligent.

# <u> Israel</u>

The country has maintained a very conservative approach to culture and traditions. As the years progressed and the Islamic State Gained strength, Israel developed toward a more military approach of politics.

Israel will be the country where the Messiah first appears; with the majority of its population supporting him. After this occurred, a massive support from the international community surges.

Japan continued its projected development growth in the economic and technological realm. Other than that,

Japan will grow into a critical actor in the outer space race.

#### <u>Korea</u>

Deriving from the ever growing military power from North Korea, and the counterfeiting from the western world through South Korea, the unification of Korea was made possible as a *negative peace* solution, with the sole purpose of sparing the possibility of belligerent conflict.

The country still maintains a strong military influence. Nevertheless, it has adopted diplomatic and democratic alternatives as its influence on the UN increase.

## **Netherlands**

- 5. Population: 20'000,000
- 6. Major religions: Roman Catholic 23.6%, Protestant 14.9% (includes Dutch Reformed 6.4%, Protestant Church of The Netherlands 5.6%, Calvinist 2.9%), Muslim 5.1%, other 5.6%
- 7. GDP (in PPP; in US trillions): 1,5 trillion dollars

The Netherlands will act as a very neutral delegation, as the majority of IR aspects have remained constant for this country, as well as societal organisation, demographics, and tendencies.

The Netherlands will try to avoid supporting the escalation of conflict, but isn't entirely closed to the idea, as anything could happen during the debate. Particularly, as it is inclined toward a safe, moral and just treatment of humankind. Consequently, striving to achieve this.

The delegation is expected to take a leading role regarding an overcoming of rising sea levels due to its knowledge and experience on the topic.

## Oceanic Aotearoa (OA)

- 7. GDP (in PPP; in US trillions): 3 trillion dollars

In recognising their similar attitudes towards global politics and international relations; and, in seeking new opportunities for economic growth and development, the unification of Oceania (Australia, New Zealand, etc) became known as the Oceanic Aotearoa (or OA for short).

The OA will be heavily impacted from the rising sea levels caused by climate change, losing most of its territory. This will prompt difficult socioeconomic and organisational challenges for the country's future development. In turn, the race for space within OA's territory may be the cause for civil conflicts; as well as mass migration to other countries.

## Russia (New USSR)

- 3. Date of Independence/Establishment: 25 December 1991 (from the Soviet Union) / New USSR 2041
- 4. Official language(s): Russian
- 5. Population: 110'000,000
- 6. Major religions: Russian orthodox, Muslim
- 7. GDP (in PPP; in US trillions): 7 trillion dollars

As Vladimir Putin's regime became progressively less successful in shutting down opposition, it decided to annex territories near Russia (similar to those from the Soviet Union) in order to gain popularity. The means designated to this purpose were not particularly amicable. As a result, international approval and overall look on Russia plummeted.

The newly annexed territories have yet to be recognized internationally, but citizens from the involved countries have agreed to the change. With this, the New USSR, or the Soviet Russian Federation will have a similar perspective on politics and legislation.

As aforementioned, its international relationships are not the best, especially with Siberia, a portion of former Russia that adjourned after feeling unheard and unrepresented in Russia's government. Moreover, Russia's relations with the US have progressively worsened and are currently at a critical state.

# <u>Siberia</u>

- 2. Government system: Multi-party system, democracy
- 3. Date of Independence/Establishment: 2042
- 4. Official language(s): Russian
- 5. Population: 20'000,000
- 6. Major religions: Islam
- 7. GDP (in PPP; in US trillions): 2,5 trillion dollars

Siberia began a process of separation, primarily due to a deep and strong disagreement with the politics of former Russia. Process started in 2035, after Russia's drastic policies and expansionist intentions.

After this process ended in 2042, Siberia struggled with its economy and has slowly regained some power. With rising tensions amongst it and Russia, the future of the country is still unknown.

Nevertheless, socioculturally, Siberia has found itself profoundly well. A multi-party democracy has fomented development in the country, creating a unified and civic Siberia.

The country has adopted a very diplomatic and meditative posture during the past years. Hence, building very good international relationships and allies.

# <u>Turkey</u>

   (mostly Christians and Jews)
- 7. GDP (in PPP; in US trillions): 5,2 trillion dollars

Being a muslim majority nation, Turkey will be divided between joining the emerging Islamic state and mantaining the international relations it built through history.

In terms of data, however, it has stayed in constant development through the years, with little to no changes in international policy, GDP and population growth rate, and internal conflicts.

## United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland

The UK will be part of the group of countries who will want to inhibit the establishment of an Islamic Republic because of historical tensions and major religion within the delegation.
